Format:

The exam will be **one hour** in duration and will consist of short written responses, calculations and graph work. The questions will test ability in four areas:

1. Comprehension – understanding of key concepts.
2. Evaluation – ability to interpret data.
3. Investigative – ability to plan fair tests and to use tables and graphs.
4. Calculations – ability to use formulae and to calculate values.

Topic / Booklet	Main revision points
Forces and their effects	What forces do; contact and non-contact forces; measuring forces; friction; density; balanced forces.
Sex and Science	Male and female reproductive systems; fertilisation; growth and development of the foetus; puberty and hormones.
Bubbles, bangs and burning	Physical and chemical changes; tests for hydrogen, carbon dioxide and oxygen; fire triangle; carbon monoxide
Electrical Circuits	Electrical symbols; differences between conductors and insulators; fuses; series and parallel circuits; resistance and dangerous electric currents.
Tissues and Transplants	Plant and animal organs; microscope; plant and animal cells; functions (jobs) of the parts of plant and animal cells; tissues and how they are adapted; organ systems.
Acids and Alkalis	Types of acids and alkalis and dangers; difference between dilute and concentrated acids; what an indicator does; what is a neutral substance; pH scale.
